This quarter was one of pride, reflection, and joy as we officially marked our 10th anniversary in August 2025 under the theme, "A Wave of Unbreakable Legacy". Ten years ago, a small group of trans Jamaicans came together with one shared dream: To build a country where transgender and gender-diverse people could live openly, safely, and proudly. Today, that dream continues to thrive, ripple by ripple, through every program, partnership, and life touched by TransWave's work.



Our tenth anniversary is more than a celebration! It's a powerful reminder of endurance and progress. In a global climate where funding for trans-led initiatives has declined, TransWave continues to rise above the tide. Our persistence speaks to a community that refuses to be erased, a movement that continues to lead with courage and compassion, and a decade that stands as a living testament to what happens when trans people are empowered to lead.

From mutual aid and psychosocial support to cultural celebration and historical documentation, Quarter 3 reflected the full spectrum of our mission, vision and position: advocacy, empowerment, and love in action.



COMPASSION IN MOTION

Mutual Aid Program

Thanks to the ongoing support GiveOut of and Rainbow Railroad. our Mutual Aid Programme continued to meet urgent needs for members of the transgender community facing economic and housing instability. This quarter, distributed 18 care packages Kingston across and \ Catherine provided and housing assistance to four individuals alongside medical support for two others.

Each package and grant of support represented more than just 'aid'. They served as lifelines. The program has proven vital for trans Jamaicans navigating systemic barriers to healthcare, employment, and safety. Although the demand for assistance continues to grow beyond available funding, TransWave remains steadfast in its commitment to ensuring that no one in our community is left behind.

As one team member expressed, "Even when resources are stretched thin, we show up for our people; because our community's survival depends on it."

Healing Together Psychosocial Support & Community Lyme

TransWave continued to prioritize mental wellness through our Psychosocial Session and Community Lyme, hosted with support from Rainbow Railroad. The introduction of this space brought together 32 participants for an evening of reflection, open dialogue, and shared care. Guided group activities and self-care discussions helped participants build personal resilience, manage stress, and connect deeply with one another.



The session that took place was described as "refreshing and empowering" by attendees. It reaffirmed the importance of emotional wellness as part of advocacy and reminded everyone that healing is a collective act.

The success of this session lays the foundation for a more immersive residential psychosocial wellness retreat later this year. as TransWave continues to nurture both the hearts and minds of the trans community.

This quarter, TransWave Jamaica continued to fortify our relationships with regional and international partners who share our mission of advancing the rights, visibility, and wellness of transgender Jamaicans. Through ongoing collaboration with organizations such as Rainbow Railroad, GiveOut, Equality Jamaica, QueerTego, and TranscendX, we maintained vital connections that support both advocacy and direct community impact.

Our partnerships extended beyond the Caribbean this quarter, marking TransWave's growing presence on the global stage. Lamar and Sheré represented TransWave Jamaica at the Survivor Wealth Summit in Los

This platform provided a unique opportunity to highlight the intersectional realities of Caribbean trans people and the importance of survivor-led economic movements.




Later in the quarter, Sheré was invited to participate in a panel and webinar in collaboration with the Black Feminist Fund, contributing to an important discussion on Black feminist organizing and trans femme-inclusive advocacy. These engagements not only amplified Jamaican trans voices but also positioned TransWave as a key thought leader in intersectional feminist and regional human rights spaces.

TransWave stands at the forefront of amplifying trans voices from Jamaica and the Caribbean region at large. These opportuntiies help propel the movement carrying those voices with us, international across borders. despite the universal challenges being faced by LGBTOIA+ organisations globally.

The TransWave team would have also met H.E. José Antonio Cabedo, Ambassador of Chile to Jamaica. This meeting saw discussions on our organization's perspectives on the recommendations Chile made to Jamaica during the 2020 Universal Periodic Review (UPR).

Collaborating with Equality Jamaica and TranscendX was particularly impactful, laying the groundwork for joint events like the PrideShare Aphrodite Kiki Ball, and aligning advocacy efforts around trans rights and youth empowerment.

Through these partnerships, TransWave reaffirms that collective progress is built on solidarity — and that together, we can create systems of care that transcend borders.

Aphrodite Kiki Ball & Lip Sync Lollapalooza



Documenting Our Past, Inspiring Our Future




A cornerstone of this quarter was the ongoing development of The Transgender History of Jamaica, a landmark publication funded by the UNDP. This project marks the first comprehensive documentation of Jamaica's transgender movement, tracing its evolution from the 1970s to the present day.

The publication chronicles the stories of trans pioneers, the advocacy of early organizations, and the growth of our organisation itself, highlighting key events, cultural milestones, and community resilience. During Quarter 3, the project entered its final editing stage, with a planned launch in Quarter 4.

Once published, The Transgender History of Jamaica will serve as a living archive that preserves the voices and legacies that have shaped the fight for trans rights and visibility in Jamaica. As one contributor shared, "Our history is powerful and now, it's being written by us, for us."

TransWave continued to strengthen its digital footprint by updating its website with new materials, including recent annual reports, policy briefs, and research studies. These updates reflect our commitment to transparency and knowledge sharing.


